As James says, 'It just goes to show how true the saying is - there are no strangers, just friends you haven't met yet.'

Their trip is not just about pleasure. They have three charities that they support Action Aid, Oxfam and the British Heart Foundation. ${ }^{5}$ $\qquad$ During their trip they have visited some of Action Aid's projects. ## Exams are a fair way of testing students
